DAFFODILS ON THE AVENUE

Dewlay, the Traditional Cheesemakers, funding kick started the planting of daffodils in the grass verge from the Horns Inn towards Ainspool Lane. The bulbs are to be extended through the Kirkland Parish Council budget and will produce a bigger Spring display to brighten up the outlook under the canopy of the trees.

Defibrillator for Churchtown

Kirkland Parish Council is looking to provide our village with a defibrillator to be used in case of emergency. It will be part of the emergency service for



anyone using 999, who would be directed to the defibrillator in the first instance so that prompt help can be provided to the "patient" as quickly as possible. Defibrillators are user friendly, come with spoken instructions and supported by North West Ambulance Service.

It is hoped that the cost of approx £1,400.00 per unit will be raised through donations from local businesses and individuals, initially, with the Parish Council making up the difference. We invite everyone to support our effort to provide Kirkland with its first defibrillator which may well prove to be a life saver.

The site chosen will be the old telephone box at the cross on Ainspool Lane as a central location for the village. The unit requires an electric supply, which the kiosk can provide, and will be sited inside giving 24 hour access. Publicly accessible defibrillators have already proved to be highly effective in saving lives and are easy to use. They are positioned in areas where there is a concentration of people and are vital in rural areas where emergency services may take a little longer to arrive.
