Chairman's Report

Autumn brings falling leaves and whilst we enjoy the colours there is a downside. As we have already seen recently the heavy rain along with the leaves causes surface water to become problematic. If it is safe for you to do so please clear leaves from around the drains near your homes. Lancashire County Council is responsible for the main roads and the parish lengthsman also plays his part but the amount of rain is not going to get less and we need to be vigilant. If you need to report potholes, street lighting, gullies etc.

The new flood defences at the A6 end of the village were officially opened recently by Lord Shuttleworth, the Lord Lieutenant of Lancashire, and this will make a significant difference to the height the river can rise to before we are at risk of flooding. Many thanks to Roger Weatherall and Siriol Hogg of the Churchtown Flood Action Group for all their hard work.



You will have noticed that the road markings have been changed at the junction of the A6 and the A586 for traffic travelling south. As a Parish Council we do not feel that this has solved the problem of traffic turning into the garage mixing with traffic turning onto The Avenue. Ultimately, the Lancashire County Council plan is to put traffic lights at the junction but this is unlikely to happen in the near future as it is dependent on funds gained from land development elsewhere. In the meantime, take

There will shortly be an additional defibrillator available in the village. The Memorial Hall has fund raised to provide one at the hall and this now means we have access to two in the village, the other being in the Telephone Box next to the market cross.

Have your say on your roads



You can have your say on your roads and transport locally by completing a short survey. As part of a new campaign to promote the work of their highways service, Lancashire County Council is encouraging people to complete the National Highways and Transport (NHT) survey, which measures public satisfaction with services across different local authorities.

The campaign will also focus on their work fixing around 40,000 potholes a year, and ask people to report potholes on their website. This year, the council will spend £24m to maintain Lancashire's 4,600 miles of highways and 5,300 miles of footways. Continued investment has improved the condition of the county's roads, and helped to reduce the number of potholes by 38% in the last two years.

Kirkland Parish Council Accounts


