1169. VERBAL REPORTS FOR INFORMATION ONLY Report from Wyre Area Lancashire Association of Local Councils

Cllr. Mrs. M. McLeod reported Garry Payne had attended and introduced the Wyre Lottery with 60pence from each ticket going to a project of your choice. The Wyre Business Plan is being refreshed, Wyre is focussing on Community Resilience and he sent details of the enforcement scheme. The Police have a new reporting system for speeding etc.

Report from Churchtown Flood Action Group / Wyre's Flood Forum

Cllr. Mrs. S. Hogg reported on the Finishing Task Team at County Hall run by Lancashire County Council, a plan was compiled for flooding. Spoken to Garstang Millennium Green Committee about the barrier how it works its impact and that it has not worked for four years. She has attended the National Flood Forum where United Utilities said it will adopt SUDS systems on new builds, IF installed to their specification. Churchtown FLAG is looking to raise £50,000 to fund natural flood management, including leaky dams like the many installed above Scorton and farmers will get paid for flood relief on their land. Following the three recent storms the Churchtown Embankment held.

Churchtown in Bloom

Cllr. Mrs. K. Davies reported Churchtown in Bloom has entered the North West in Bloom Competition and Kirkland and Catterall St. Helen's Church of England Primary School and the Horns Inn; as a commercial premise. The theme this year is 'Grow Social' and the committee is working with the community. The school is holding a 'Muck-In' on Saturday 28th March and there will be a Spring Clean held on 3rd April from Kirkland Memorial Hall. The committee has produced a health and safety handbook for volunteers to keep them safe, with risk assessments for each area to follow.
