The Parish Council worked hard for so many years to reduce the road speed limit on the Avenue (especially past the school) and we were fortunate that this happened. The 30MPH limit is also being regularly enforced by the mobile speed camera, which is usually parked up near the entrance to Kirkland Hall.
